Dear Friends in Christ,

I am happy to report that the Rev. Geoff Doolittle, who just stepped down from St. Paul's, Owego, has agreed to be the weekly celebrant of Holy Eucharist at All Saints' while I am on sabbatical (July 8th-October 15, 2017). Father Geoff was sponsored for Holy Orders by Zion, Greene and attended Virginia Theological Seminary. He was ordained to the diaconate in December 2009 and to the priesthood in November 2010 by Bishop Adams. Fr. Geoff is married. His wife Joann is a shut-in. Fr. Geoff is very active in Cursillo and has been part of "New Beginnings" and "Happening" for youth. Please welcome him warmly to All Saints'.



Don Thorpe, Warden, and I met with Deacon Dorothy Pierce and Worship Leaders Judy Horton, Sue Mahon and Gary Zurn and ironed out the schedule for Evening Prayer and Morning Prayer at the non-Eucharist Saturday at 5 pm or Sunday at 10 am services. Deacon Dorothy will do most of the pastoral calls (hospitals etc.) but Fr. Geoff, Fr. Jim Jones, Mother Elizabeth Ewing, Mother Liz Groskopf will also help out if called. (Fr. Mark Giroux will be on vacation much of July and August and Fr. John Martinichio starts his sabbatical in June!)

As you may remember, Don Thorpe and Joy Kasmarcik led a Jumpstart All Saints' parish discussion on how to arrange worship while I am on sabbatical. It was decided by consensus that first and third Saturdays of the month would be Holy Eucharist (ergo first and third Sundays of the month would be Morning Prayer); second and fourth Sundays of the month would be Holy Eucharist (ergo second and fourth Saturdays of the month would be Evening Prayer); and fifth Saturdays and Sundays of the month would be Evening or Morning Prayer. Clear as mud right? Here's it spelled out in a different format:

Fifth Weekend of the Month
Saturday at 5 pm Evening Prayer
Sunday at 10 am Morning Prayer*

Of course, there are a few calendar quirks: sometimes there's a fifth Saturday and a first Sunday in the same weekend resulting in both services being Evening and Morning Prayer or sometimes there's a first Saturday and a second Sunday in the same weekend resulting in both services being Eucharist. But that is what makes life interesting!

While I am away if you need pastoral care or there's an emergency call the office 607-797-3354 (Tuesday – Thursday 9 am – 3 pm) or call one of the Wardens (Don Thorpe 607-748-8577 or Joy Kasmarcik 585-285-0013). They will contact Deacon Dorothy or a priest for you.

The Wardens will run Vestry meetings during my sabbatical. This will make vestry attendance for a quorum very important. But remember, there is no Vestry meeting in July! If you would like something brought up at Vestry, please speak to one of the Wardens.

I will be in the United Kingdom during July visiting London, Glasgow, Iona and York. But I am going to be around the rectory during August, September and part of October while working on icons. So, what to do? Mostly if you see me at Wegman's or walking the dogs, say "Hi!" Don't talk to me about Fr. Geoff's sermon, hymns, flowers left off of bulletins, how many pickles to order for Field Days or a leaky faucet in the bathroom. Please let me know if a parishioner dies. I may be able to attend visiting hours or the funeral officiated by other clergy.

Let's have a wonder June and summer at All Saints'!

**THE RECTOR WILL BE ON SABBATICAL JULY 8-OCTOBER 15, 2017:
PILGIMAGE TO IONA AND ICONS!**

Fulltime clergy in the Diocese of Central New York are supposed to have a three-month Sabbatical every seven years they serve a parish. A Sabbatical is a period of paid leave granted to a clergy person for study and or travel. It is done with the approval of the Bishop and the clergy's Vestry. Typically, during the Sabbatical period supply clergy lead worship services, pastoral care is given by local clergy and Wardens run Vestry meetings.

All Saints' Rector's Sabbatical was to have happened during 2011, but that was in the middle of the recession so it was postponed. She had started to make arrangements for a Sabbatical for 2015 but that's when Bishop Adams resigned and the Standing Committee went into high gear for the search and election of Bishop Duncan-Probe.

Finally, with the blessings of both Bishop and Vestry, plans are set for the Rector's Sabbatical to be July 8-October 15, 2017. The Rector will first travel to the United Kingdom to spend time in London, Glasgow, York and Iona. Iona is a small island in the Inner Hebrides off the Ross of Mull on the western coast of Scotland. It was a centre of Gaelic monasticism for four centuries and is today renowned for its tranquility, natural beauty and the Iona Community. The Iona Community, an ecumenical Christian community of men and women from different walks of life and different traditions in the Christian church committed to seeking new ways of living the Gospel of Jesus in today's world. The Iona Community runs week-long retreats.

Upon return in August, the Rector will study icons and the writing of icons. Translated literally, "icon" means "image." The image is of person from Scripture or tradition (AKA saint). The image is created or rendered in a specific manner according to specific rules. It is a form of prayer and service to God. One "writes" icons rather than "paints" icons. (Paraphrase from *A Brush with God* by Peter Pearson)



But when the Bishop offers it to Merrily Watkins, parish priest and single mother, she's in no position to refuse. It starts badly for Merrily and gets no easier. As an early winter slices through the old city of Hereford, a body is found in the River Wye, an ancient church is desecrated, and signs of evil appear in the cathedral itself, where the tomb of a medieval saint lies in pieces.”


All Saints' 2017 budget is a deficit budget that will require using \$10,973 from previous years' income equity surpluses and/or special gifts to balance the budget. Some of this gap is the result of having fewer pledges: 56 pledges in 2017 and 59 pledges in 2016. The rest is due to small increases in expenses.

In 2017, a monthly income of \$ 14,702 will be necessary to meet operating expense cash flow. This will be difficult to do as the projected income is only approximately \$13,643 per month and All Saints' major fundraising events and fundraising income occur during May, June, September and November. It can be expected that the Vestry will decide to use available surplus funds from other years for cash flow.

Therefore, it will be more important than ever to keep one's pledge up-to-date and to make additional gifts if possible. Truly, with "God all things are possible" (Mt. 19:26).
