Lesser Feast of Lancelot Andrewes, Bishop of Winchester, 1626

Dear Friends in Christ,

If I ever name a dog not after a martyred bishop, I think it would be Lancelot



Andrewes (1555-1626). Either his first name or his surname would be a super moniker for a Silky Terrier! So often the bishops we commemorate are those who gave their lives for the sake of the Gospel and we overlook those who had more placid lives and made contributions to biblical scholarship and church polity. He was a churchman (in succession Bishop of Chichester then of Winchester) during the reigns of Elizabeth I and James I giving shape and form to the Church of England and demonstrating the "Via Media" between the competing Catholic and Protestant factions. He was the favorite preacher of James I and a distinguished biblical scholar—proficient in Hebrew and Greek. He was one of the translators of the King James Bible (KJV). Check out the KJV's translation of Psalm 23—it's Lancelot Andrewes'!

The week of September 9th All Saints' and the Diocese of Central New York entered Step Three of Gathering Anew which means we may have 33% of capacity, or 50 persons, whichever is less, come for in-person worship services. All the requirements for hand sanitizing, mask wearing and cleaning from Step Two remain in place in Step Three. Please if you are sick or of a vulnerable population, stay at home and join the service online (Zoom and Facebook Live) or by phone. However, we gather—by Zoom, Facebook Live, phone or in-person—we gather together as the Body of Christ. (For more information please see article below.)

Activities will ramp up at All Saints' this October. St. Francis Blessing of Animals will take place on the front lawn on Sunday October 4th at approximately 11:30 am. Besides the in-person and online celebrations of Holy Communion on Saturdays at 5:00 pm and Sundays at 10:30 am, there are Zoom and Facebook Live services of Evening Prayer on Sundays at 5:00 pm and of Compline on Thursdays at 8 pm. "Dwelling in the Word" continues by Zoom on Sundays at 9:00 am and Book Club by Zoom on the last Wednesday of the month. Plus, our Cub Scout Pack 100 meets on Monday evening and Scout Troops 110 and 6110 meet on Tuesday. Our CHOW Pantry is open Monday through Thursday at 10:00 am. Soup & Sandwiches Saturdays serve take-out/drive-thru lunches to an average of 90+ people every Saturday.

Let's keep in touch and gather in Jesus' name using all the platforms that are available to us in 2020!

DIOCESE AND ALL SAINTS 'TO ENTER <u>STEP THREE</u> ON THE JOURNEY TO GATHERING ANEW

Beginning the week of September 9, 2020, the Diocese of Central New York and All Saints 'Church entered Step Three of "Gathering Anew." In this step limited in-person gatherings of 50 or less for worship are permitted. As in Step Two, in Step Three celebrations of Eucharist conveyed in Bread only with safety precautions are permitted.

In addition to allowing worship in-person attendance of 50 or less, Step Three allows for there to be one soloist who must be at least 15 feet distanced from others and preaching may be done with the mask removed if there is at least 15 feet of distance from the pulpit to occupied pews. Prevention of the spread of COVID-19 continues to be a priority. Therefore, excepting a raise in the COVID-19 infection rate in the Diocese of Central New York, at All Saints' there will two short services of Holy Communion offered for a maximum of 50 people inperson (including clergy, readers, ushers and musicians): Saturdays at 5:00 pm and Sundays at 10:30 am. "Dwelling in the Word" will still be held every Sunday at 9:00 am by Zoom only. Compline on Thursdays at 8:00 pm and Evening Prayer on Sundays at 5 pm will be offered by Zoom and Facebook Live.

Since 50 is near to All Saints' pre-COVID-19 average attendance, at this time there is no longer a need to call ahead and reserve a place. However, it is required that everyone in attendance sign-in when they arrive in the Narthex and leave contact information.

The two weekend in-person services will also be available by Zoom and on Facebook Live. Please if you are sick or of a vulnerable population, stay at home and join the service online or by phone.

In addition to Holy Communion being offered in Bread only, everyone must wear a mask which covers both nose and mouth, wash hands or use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving church and before and after receiving Communion. There will be no congregational singing—only instrumental music and one soloist. All those attending are asked to practice 6 feet of physical distancing and there is to be no physical contact—handshakes or hugs. The Peace may be "passed" by remaining in place and bowing, waving, or practicing the sign-language "peace." Everyone who receives Communion is asked to consume the Host when they return to their pew, briefly removing their mask to do so. There will be no "Coffee Hour." Because of COVID precautions there is no nursery.

DISINFECTING WIPES NEEDED

All Saints' stockpile of disinfecting wipes has dwindled and very often the stores shelves have been emptied as well. In the meantime, All Saints' has found a spray-on hospital grade disinfecting solution and washable clothes to use to clean. But some disinfecting wipes are needed for in-between cleaning times in the bathrooms, etc. The Rector has occasionally found some wipes available on her shopping trips and has brought them in. Therefore, if you are shopping and you find a container of disinfecting wipes available please pick one up for the church and bring it next time you come. You will be helping All Saints' stay safe for everyone!

THE APOSTLES

Jude or Thaddeus

Jude, Thaddeus, or Lebbeus, son of Alpheus or Cleophas and Mary. He was a brother of James the Younger. He was one of the very little-known Apostles and lived in Galilee. Tradition says he preached in Assyria and Persia and died a martyr in Persia.

Jerome called Jude "Trinomious" which means "a man with three names." In Mark 3:18 he is called Thaddeus. In Matthew 10:3 he is called Lebbeus. His surname was Thaddeus. In Luke 6:16 and Acts 1:13 he is called Judas the brother of James. Judas Thaddeus also was called Judas the Zealot.

By character he was an intense and violent Nationalist with the dream of world power and domination by the Chosen People. In the New Testament records (John 14:22 NIV) he asked Jesus at the Last Supper, "But Lord, why do you intend to show yourself to us and not to the world?" Judas Thaddeus was interested in making Christ known to the world. Not as a suffering Saviour, however, but as ruling King. We can see plainly from the answer Jesus gave him, that the way of power can never be substituted for the way of love.

It is said that Jude went to preach the gospel in Edessa near the Euphrates River. There he healed many and many believed in the name of the Master. Jude went from there to preach the Gospel in other places. He was killed with arrows at Ararat. The chosen symbol for him is the ship because he was a missionary thought to be a fisherman.

BOOK CLUB TO MEET DIGITALLY BY ZOOM ON WEDNESDAY OCTOBER 28th at 5:30 PM! READING BEST OF ENEMIES BY OSHA GRAY DAVIDSON

Since *Crossways* will go to press before the September Book Club meeting, saying what the Book Club will be reading is always a challenge. As the Book Club's pace is set by members, the Book Club in October will probably be still be reading Osha Gray Davidson's book *Best of Enemies*. Here's the publisher's blurb:

The Best of Enemies by Osha Gray Davidson (e-format \$9.99 and paperback \$12.99) "C. P. Ellis grew up in the poor white section of Durham, North Carolina, and as a young man joined the Ku Klux Klan. Ann Atwater, a single mother from the poor black part of town, quit her job as a household domestic to join the civil rights fight. During the 1960s, as the country struggled with the explosive issue of race, Ellis and Atwater met on opposite sides of the public school integration issue. Their encounters were charged with hatred and suspicion. In an amazing set of transformations, however, each of them came to see how the other had been exploited by the South's rigid power structure, and they forged a friendship that flourished against a backdrop of unrelenting bigotry.

"Now a major motion picture, *The Best of Enemies* offers a vivid portrait of a relationship that defied all odds."

Silver Bells Christmas Gift program for Senior Citizens

Silver Bells 2020

Thank you for your interest in this year's Silver Bells program. Last year, your participation was instrumental to our success, and we were able to provide 100+gifts and lots of Christmas cheer to local senior citizens.

As you know, this year is not a typical year. However, we strongly feel that now, more than ever, older adults need to feel connected. COVID-19 has increased the isolation of many older adults and we would like this program to be a reminder that they are loved this holiday season.

In light of the pandemic, we have been working on ways to make sure we are doing everything we can to ensure the safety of all involved.

- 1. We are not distributing gift tags. We will be using an online software tool called Sign Up Genius (https://www.signupgenius.com/).
 - This tool will allow us to make lists for your congregation to access online, see what gifts have not been taken and chose the gift they would like to purchase. When they "sign up", it is visible to all others which senior is taken and what gifts are left.
 - If you are concerned that some of your congregation does not utilize the Internet, we will be happy to discuss some ideas how you can adapt to make it accessible to those church members.
 - Because we will not have tags, shoppers will need to make sure to identify who the gift is for.

- 2. We will not be using volunteers to wrap presents this year. Our staff (4 people) will be the only ones handling the gifts before delivery. This will greatly reduce the amount of personal contact with the gifts.
 - We will only be using gift bags this year.
 - Shoppers may provide a gift bag, or we will supply one.
- 3. The volunteers who distribute the gifts will provide delivery with as little contact as possible.
 - Gifts will be left at the door. The volunteer will wait to make sure the senior takes their gift.
 - Our volunteers follow CDC guidelines involving social distancing, wearing masks and washing hands frequently.

- November 9th Lists for churches will be sent
- December 14th 18th Gifts will be picked up at your church
- December 21 & 22 Gifts will be delivered

We are requesting each church to take a minimum of 20 names. Please let us know if you would like to participate and the number of names you would like.








Puzzle!
