Feast of the Holy Innocents



This feast, the Holy Innocents, sticks out of the season of Christmas—remember 12 days of Christmas—like a sore thumb. Amidst the glitter, bright lights and peaceful nativity sets, Holy Innocents come crashing into the peace of Christmastide with all of King Herod's ruthless, murderous rage, the slaughter of all male children under the age of two in Bethlehem and the region and the grief and cries of their parents. The Christ Child, Mary and Joseph escape this carnage having been warned by an angel in a dream and become refugees in Egypt. Not a very auspicious start to redemption and eternal life. But we know the story did not end there or even with Jesus' death and resurrection. The story of God's love continues in each of us who follow the Risen Christ. For we are Christ's hands and hearts in the world.

While the Church Year—B—began at the end of November with the First Sunday of Advent, our calendar year 2021 begins on January 1st. With COVID-19 infection rates still high, hybrid-school, livestreamed worship services and “Dwelling in the Word,” telemedicine replacing doctor's visits, mask requirements, hand sanitizing and keeping 6 feet of physical distance the beginning of 2021 will probably look a lot like the end of 2020. All Saints' will continue to hold worship services by ZOOM and Facebook Live. (See schedule below). Likewise, Vestry, Book Club, PB&B “Lunch Bunch,” and Diocesan meetings will also be virtual.

Our Annual Meeting will be held by ZOOM on Sunday January 24, 2021 at 11:30 pm. New York State Religious Corporation Law, the Diocesan Canons and All Saints' By-Laws all require All Saints' to have an Annual Meeting on the third Sunday after the first Monday in January—pandemic or no pandemic. The meeting will be held on ZOOM and all parishioners are encouraged to attend the ZOOM Annual Meeting by computer, tablet, smartphone, or telephone. If you do not normally connect by ZOOM, please make an effort to do so in order that we have a quorum. If you cannot connect, please let me or Deacon Dorothy know, and we will telephone you so you can participate in the meeting.

DWELLING IN THE WORD CONTINUES SUNDAYS AT 9:00 AM VIA ZOOM

"Dwelling in the Word," Bible Study, will continue Sundays at 9:00AM via "Zoom." "Dwelling in the Word" is a way of spiritually listening to the text as one way God speaks to us, with a willingness to be shaped by what God might want to say through the Scripture. Throughout Christmastide and the beginning of the season of Epiphany we are "dwelling" with the Prologue to John's Gospel: John 1:1-18 in a variety of translations. Portions of the Prologue are part of the lectionary readings for Christmas and Epiphany. After Epiphany 1, we will dwell with the Gospel for Epiphany 5, Mark 1:29-39 until Lent.

Here's the process:

- Pray for insight;
- Read the passage aloud slowly and pause for reflection;
- Read the passage slowly again and pause for reflection;
- Then share as the Spirit moves you

As we listen to the Scripture we think about:

- What caught your attention, what shimmered for you or what touched your heart?
- What question(s) you would want to ask?
- What are we hearing? Where might the Spirit be nudging me or All Saints'?



The Final Word 

Worry: Philippians 4:6 – “Don’t worry about anything; instead, pray about everything...”
