March 1, 2014 Feast of David, Bishop of Menevia, Wales, c.544

#### Dear Friends in Christ,

For several years I was a member of St. David's Church, Dewitt. I returned there for my deaconate and later served as a supply priest during an interim period. So March 1st as St. David's Dav has always held a special place in my heart. I expect leeks to be served and to see vases of daffodils—symbols of St. David—on March 1<sup>st</sup>. But St. David is much more than daffodils and leeks. In his time Wales was the only portion of Britain that was Christian: the Angles, Saxons and Jutes (pagans all) having control of the rest. At a young age he founded a monastery and became its abbot. A man of moderation, his nickname was "the Waterman" because he allowed the monks of his monastery



to drink only water: not wine or ale. He was a scholar and preferred a cloistered life. Yet as Bishop of Menevia and Primate of Wales he became an administrator, fought against the Pelagian heresy, made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem and founded eleven other monasteries. His last words in a sermon to his community were, "Be joyful, and keep your faith and your creed, and do the little things that you have seen me do and heard about. I will walk the path that our fathers have trod before us." "Do ye the little things in life" has become a well-known phrase in Welsh. Saint David is the perfect saint for Lent which begins on March 5th: temperate, if not ascetic, contemplative and faithful.

So I invite you to join me and observe a holy Lent. The Prayer Book Lenten invitation asks that we keep Lent "self-examination and repentance; by prayer fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." How we to this is left up to each of us. For a start, there are services of Holy Eucharist with Imposition of Ashes on Ash Wednesday, March 5th at 6:30 AM, 10 AM, and 7 PM. For those who might wish to read, listen, discuss and worship there is the Lenten Series, "Hallelujah: The Bible and Handel's Messiah" on Sundays beginning March 9th at 5:30 PM. (See article below for more information.) Meanwhile the Wednesday Holy Eucharist at 10 AM continues throughout Lent. Finally, during Holy Week there will also be celebrations of Holy Eucharist at 7 AM in addition to the usual Tridium services.

But what if family, work or school demands make it impossible for one to participate in any of the above? Try setting up a time just to spend a few moments in prayer in the morning or at night. (The lengthening days make it easier to set one's alarm clock earlier.) Or maybe try incorporating prayer into your morning walk with or without dogs — or daily exercise. Perhaps pick up the Forward Day by Day or a copy of the Episcopal Relief & Development 2014 Lenten Mediation booklet and read the daily readings and meditations. Computer savvy? Try praying the Daily Office online (www.missionstclare.com/) or doing a labyrinth [continued page 2]

(www.gracecathedral.org/labyrinth) or visiting Taize online (www.taize.fr/). Still searching? Look at Anglicans Online Lenten Resources, there's sure to be something there that may work for you (http://anglicansonline.org/special/lent.html). The possibilities are endless.

Come and observe a holy Lent at All Saints'. Or in Saint David's word's: "Be joyful, and keep your faith and your creed, and do the little things that you have seen me do and heard about." Then we'll "walk the path that our fathers have trod before us."

# Kerygma's Hallelujah: the Bible and Handel's *Messiah* Continues Beginning Sunday, March 9<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 PM: Sign-up Now!

"He was despised," "I know that my Redeemer liveth," Since by man came death": these are all musical numbers from the "Lent/Easter" portion of Handel's *Messiah*. So if you like to listen to or sing Handel's Messiah or if you are interested in a Lenten Bible Study, look no further! Beginning on the first Sunday of Lent, March 9<sup>th</sup> All Saints' will be presenting Kerygma's *Hallelujah: The Bible and Handel's Messiah* on Sundays at 5:30 PM.



The course is designed to deepen appreciation of both the words and the music of Handel's Messiah. Because it is primarily a Bible study curriculum, the focus will be naturally on the Bible. Yet it would be a waste of resources to concentrate only on the biblical texts without attention to how they are interpreted in Messiah. You do not need to be an expert in either music or the Bible to enjoy this course. The only real requirements are that one has:

- A genuine interest in learning more about the Bible,
- A desire to appreciate Handel's Messiah more deep,
- A commitment to read and study and to attend the sessions faithfully.

Each Sunday evening will begin at 5:30 PM with a simple Soup and Bread Supper followed by the program, Kerygma's *Hallelujah: The Bible and Handel's Messiah*. The evening will conclude with a Taizé Compline in the chapel. Interested? Sign-up in the Narthex as soon as possible.



All Saints' 2014 budget—it is not a balanced budget. The 2014 budget is once again a "faith-based" budget. In other words, it will require <u>faith</u> to create \$15,217 more income for 2014 for operating expenses than budgeted. The need for \$15,217 in "Faith Income" for 2014 is primarily due to having only 58 pledges\* for a total of \$129,462. Compared to the actual for 2013 of 67 pledges for \$139,194 there are 10 less pledges (58 pledges for \$129,462). In 2014 a monthly income of \$14,300 will be needed to balance the expenses. If you haven't pledged or asked for a set of envelopes, please do. Please try to keep up your pledges. It really helps All Saints' cash flow. Truly, with "God all things are possible" (Mt. 19:26)



#### Repayment of the Unified Investment Fund (Uif) Unrestricted Reserve Fund

In 2012 All Saints' used \$30,000 from its Unrestricted Reserve Fund held as part of the Diocesan Unified Investment Fund (UIF). The Vestry is committed to restoring the \$30,000 as quickly as possible. As a result, funds received towards this purpose and towards Rebuilding All Saints' (RAS), will be transferred to the Unrestricted Reserve Fund as soon as the cash flow allows. As of February 2014 \$24,247 was transferred into the UIF Unrestricted Reserve Fund and \$2,500 is held in a designated savings account. This brings the total amount restored to the Unrestricted Reserve Fund up to \$26,747!
